Italian Language: Level II [4-Week Intensive Course]

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Course Description

The intensive second level course's objective is to solidify all of the linguistic skills covered in level one, while at the same time introducing new, more complex structures.

We will utilize an integrated communication method that puts the student at the center of the learning process in a cooperative relationship with the teacher. This perspective is based on the principle of the negotiation of the content of the course and the teaching strategies.

The students will be taught not only the linguistic system, but they will be given strategies and techniques that facilitate the learning process. All of the didactic materials used throughout the course, such as textbooks and multimedia devices, are in Italian.

Course Hours

The course meets five times a week for a total of 15 hours a week.

Student Learning Expectations

At the end of the course the student will be able to use Italian to communicate efficiently. The student will be able to express his or her own thoughts and be proficient in both practical and intellectual uses of the language. Grammatical knowledge and the practical use of Italian will always coincide to allow the student to learn the language and at the same to learn how to learn.



Course Outline

Week I General review with particular attention to: passato prossimo

and imperfetto.

Telling events in the past.

Vocabulary: clothing and accessories.

Week II Combined pronouns.

Verbs 'bastare' 'servire'. and imperative Formal Informal with pronouns. Imperative. directly Give advice and indirectly. Ask advice.

Vocabulary: food.

Week III Irregular comparatives and superlatives.

Relative pronouns.

Make comparisons.

Describe a city.

Vocabulary: house I.

Week IV Present and past conditional.

Epress criticism and complaints. Express regrets.

Vocabulary: house II.

Daily homework will consist of readings, writing, exercises on the text book, short papers. They may be both individual or collective.

Final Exam.

The final written test will last an hour and a half. It will consist of multiple choice questions, short answers, short essays, reading and comprehension tests, etc. Concerning the oral test, the subject will be agreed upon with the teacher. It will consist of a presentation on the aforementioned subject lasting 10 minutes as well as 10 minutes for the teacher's questions.
